Second Quarter Results Reflect Growth and Momentum

When the Chamber Board approved the 2025 Plan of Action, we committed to providing quarterly updates to the membership on the progress of the plan. As we conclude our second quarter, I am pleased to report that we continue to make progress on all five of our 2025 priorities. Thank you to the board and all members for your continued involvement and support.

MEMBERSHIP GOAL - MEMBER VALUE

Continue providing recognized value that results in an increase in new members and retaining existing members.

Q2 Results:

- Thank you to the members who have renewed their membership and to the new members who have joined. We are **500** members strong! This means members have 500 businesses with whom to connect and keep the Hudson area's economy strong.
- Plans are underway for the annual **Chamber MAX** event on September 16 where we will celebrate existing members and help potential members learn about the Chamber.
- The **2025 Community & Membership Guide** was sent out with additional copies available for your office and waiting rooms. This new and improved guide is a year-around resource that shows the vibrant businesses, services, and organizations in the area.
- The monthly **Connections & Coffee** meetings, with 137 attendees this past quarter and continues to be a great opportunity for members to promote their business and learn about a featured business.
- The **Let's Do Lunch!** monthly program, with 53 attending the last three months, supports local restaurants while providing an opportunity for members to enjoy lunch and network with other members.
- Presented **Good Morning Hudson** programs including Legislative Update and Local Municipal Government Leaders with 95 attendees.
- Ambassadors attended 18 ribbon cuttings welcoming new members to the Chamber and celebrating member milestones.

CHAMBER PROGRAMS & SERVICES CONNECTIONS

Develop and coordinate events that address the needs and interests of members while meeting Chamber financial goals.

Q2 Results:

- **Hudson Community Expo** drew 1,540 attendees with 109 vendor booths, 5 food vendors and 54 craft booths through Coco's Heart Dog Rescue.
- Over \$7,000 was spent locally and kept within the community through the March **Lucky Clover Contest** with 46 businesses participating.
- April featured the **Small Business Crawl** with local activities, specials, and demonstrations throughout the community with an after-party at Ziggy's Live Music, Bar & Restaurant.
- The second **Simply Connect** of the year was held at Carpenter St. Croix Valley Nature Center in Hudson.
- **Leadership Hudson** wrapped up in May with 21 participants graduating.
- **The Golf Tournament** was a sold-out event at White Eagle with 144 golfers with 25 volunteers and included a hole-in-one on hole #13.

TOURISM - PROMOTION

Increase the economic benefits of tourism to the community by marketing Hudson as a community to explore, visit, and support for both local and tourism audiences.

Q2 Results:

- 793 visitor packets requested year to date.
- Implemented the 2025 marketing plan, which includes ad placements, social media, and website enhancements to drive visitors to Hudson.

Hudson Area Chamber Sustainability Corner

Summer is a great time to get outside and enjoy everything nature has to offer, including Hudson's beautiful riverways, beaches, and lakes. When you go on your aquatic adventure, it's important to take your trash with you when you return home. Leaving litter behind can be harmful for wildlife and reduces the natural beauty of these scenic water areas. Whether you are swimming, boating, paddle boarding, or walking along the shoreline, be mindful of the animals who call the water home. Plan to bring a garbage bag with you to make trash collection easier and consider picking up other litter you find along the way.
