Downtown Hudson Parking Update

Many of you have probably seen the new parking fee collection units around the streets of downtown Hudson. The City has been putting the final touches on the plan, and the new units will be enforced starting on November 4.

Important notes:

- During the month of November, only warning tickets will be issued; this will help to educate our community members, businesses and visitors about the new parking changes
- Two-hour free parking will still be honored during the Holiday season
- Residents and visitors can download an app onto a smart phone to pay online, or the parking fee collection units also accept coin or credit cards
- Take a picture, write it down, or remember your license plate number; you will need this at the pay stations
- Be patient! There will be questions and unfamiliarity with the changes. But, research concluded that these changes will create more movement to downtown parking and allow people to enjoy downtown even more
- Remember that there is still free parking around the parameters of downtown
